KK Nairobi Monthly Security Update June 2009

General

After a period of relative quiet, criminal activity has increased over the last month.

Crime Highlights

Cattle rustling, continued throughout the month. Kidnappings, which were almost unheard of previously, became more prevalent posing a serious problem to the police. Vehicle hijacks and robberies, community skirmishes and extortion syndicates were also in evidence. Incidents of Mungiki violence and robbers-posing-as-police-officers also occurred.

There was however, a determined police response to crime with relative success. After a spate of robberies targeting bank clients at ATMs, for example, police were able to arrest the perpetrators. Several other robbers who masqueraded as police officers were arrested, putting a halt, at least on a temporary basis, to this kind of crime - especially in Nairobi. Police were also able to break a SMS extortion racket that was run by prisoners inside Kamiti Maximum Security Prison.

53 criminals were reported killed during the period. Nineteen of these were lynched by the members of the public. Some 19 firearms and several rounds of ammunition were recovered. Sixteen police officers were killed on duty and several others were injured. Ten were killed in confrontations with cattle rustlers while the others fell to gangsters.

Kidnaps

Over the month of June, kidnappings steadily rose, suggesting that this was the 'crime of choice'. The consolation, however, was that the police seemed to be able to match up to the criminals with nearly all the victims freed and suspects arrested. However, given the intimidating nature of kidnaps and ransom demands, it is very probable that the majority of kidnap attempts were not reported. The method used by the kidnappers was nearly similar and the majority of the cases involved children. But incidents against adults appear to be increasing, possibly because they are easier to manage than children. In the case of children, they were grabbed in the early mornings as they went to school. Adults were captured after being carjacked or picked up near restaurants and social places.

Treatment of the victims also varied. Early in the month, the victims reported being taken good care of by the kidnappers. After all, it was in the kidnappers' interest to have their victims in good condition for ransom. However, towards the end of the month, some victims reported ill-treatment by their captors and being denied food.

Some Incidents

A trader went missing after being kidnapped by a gang in Kayole on June 1. In Mombasa on June 4, a student was kidnapped on his way to school. In Nakuru on June 7, a two-and-a-half year child was kidnapped on June 7. In Parklands, Nairobi on June 11, a student was kidnapped on his way to school. On June 13 in Komarock, another student was grabbed by kidnappers. In Bahati, Nairobi on June 17 a child was grabbed on his way to school. In Githurai, a banker was grabbed on June 19. On June 18, a retired banker was kidnapped in the same area. The kidnappers demanded Kshs 350,000 ransom. On June 27, police rescued a child from kidnappers in Githurai Kimbo. June 30, a student was grabbed from his father by kidnappers in Saika. All but two of the victims were rescued by police.

Carjackings

For most of the month, there was a noticeable change in tactics as far as carjackings were concerned. Whereas previous carjackings seemed to target the vehicle for sale, with the victims robbed as incidental, the month witnessed a variation to this trend. Criminals targeted motorists not to steal the vehicles, but to rob the occupants of whatever they were carrying jewellery, cash, mobile phones, money and even ATM cards. In the cases where the vehicle was stolen, it was dumped and recovered in most cases. The other noticeable shift was in the number of fatalities. They were relatively low considering that armed robbers were responsible all the time. Two fatalities associated with this were reported in Westlands and Thika, however. In several other incidents in Nairobi, the victims were shot and injured. However, those that cooperated with the criminals, were robbed of their possessions and later abandoned. Kilimani area in Nairobi recorded the largest number of incidents throughout the month. In areas such as Eastleigh and Githurai, matatu hijacks were the dominant crime with passengers robbed and dumped. One bus was attacked during the month.

Cattle Rustling

Turkana, Pokot Isiolo and Samburu areas recorded intensified cattle rustling attacks. Cattle rustling by the Samburu against the Borana in Isiolo were among the most deadly, claiming the lives of eight police officers with several others injured. Thousands of livestock were stolen. Trans Nzoia's Aruba and Kesogon areas also witnessed several attacks with tens of animals stolen. In Turkana, Pokot cattle rustlers also shot and killed three police officers who were in a security operation against them. Eight hundred livestock were stolen. Other notable cases were in Kuria although these appeared to be inter-clan skirmishes. Several people were killed and hundreds of animals stolen.

Burglaries

The residential districts of Kileleshwa, Lavington, Spring Valley and Runda recorded cases of burglaries and break-ins. There were no trends to suggest planning by organized crime syndicates although possibilities were that groups of criminals may in some cases have connived with domestic workers to rob the premises. The main items stolen were money and electronics. There were no fatalities reported in this crime, although injuries to the victims were common. In Industrial Area, break-ins and robberies dominated, with attacks on traders being reported in some instances. There is evidence to suggest that robberies in Industrial Area have involved considerable planning and subversion of staff.

Mungiki

The standoff between Mungiki and anti-Mungiki vigilantes in Kirinyaga continued with at least three people killed in the area by Mungiki. Several houses were torched. The vigilantes, in their turn also forced a Mungiki member to hang himself.

Outlook

With the increase in criminal activity, police are expected increase the pressure hopefully with positive results.

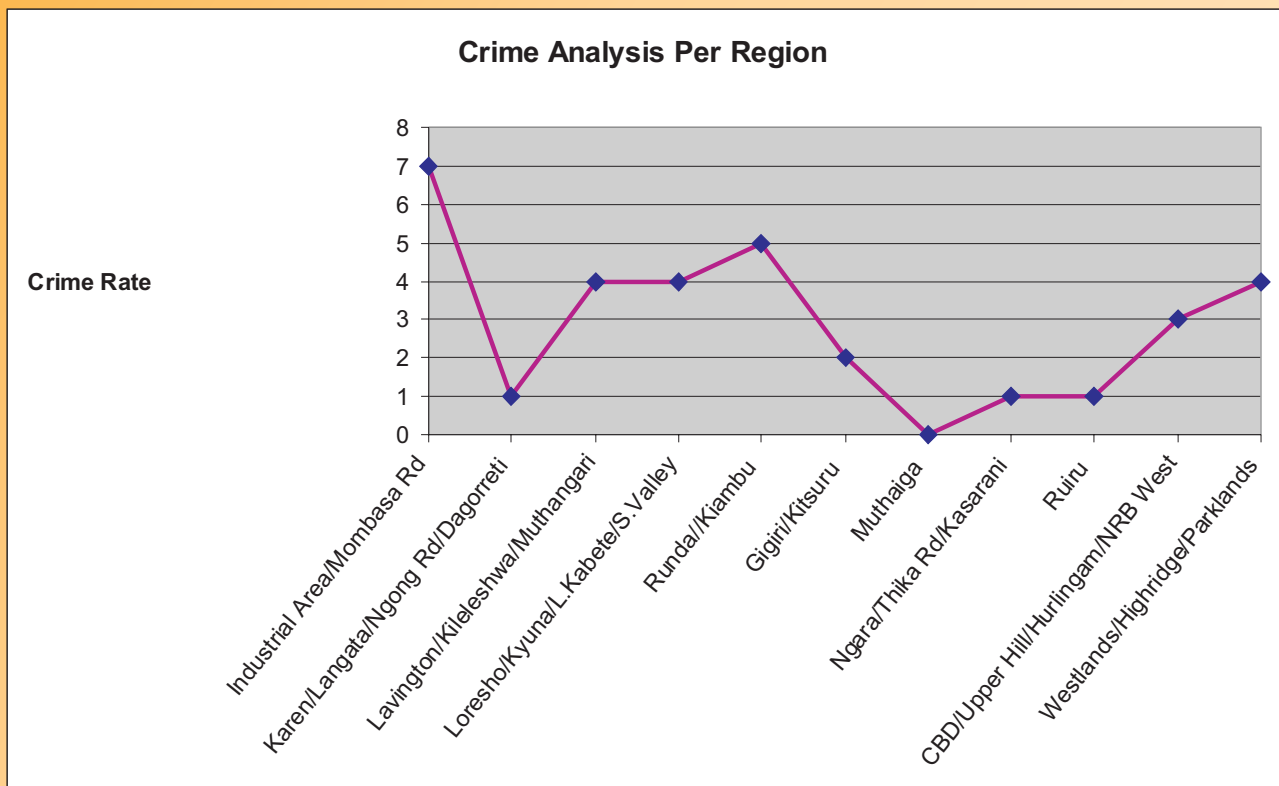

Alarm activation was received from the premises and the area KK mobile response vehicle dispatched to attend. Investigations revealed that the alarm had been pressed by private guard manning the premises after a tenant and another passenger had been carjacked at the gate by four armed thugs as she waited to be opened for. The thugs then took control of the tenant's vehicle registration number KAZ XXXX Toyota Platz silver grey in colour and drove off towards Thogoto with the two occupants on board. The thugs then robbed the two and dumped them at Thogoto where they were traced by the back up and assisted to Kingeero police station to make a formal report.

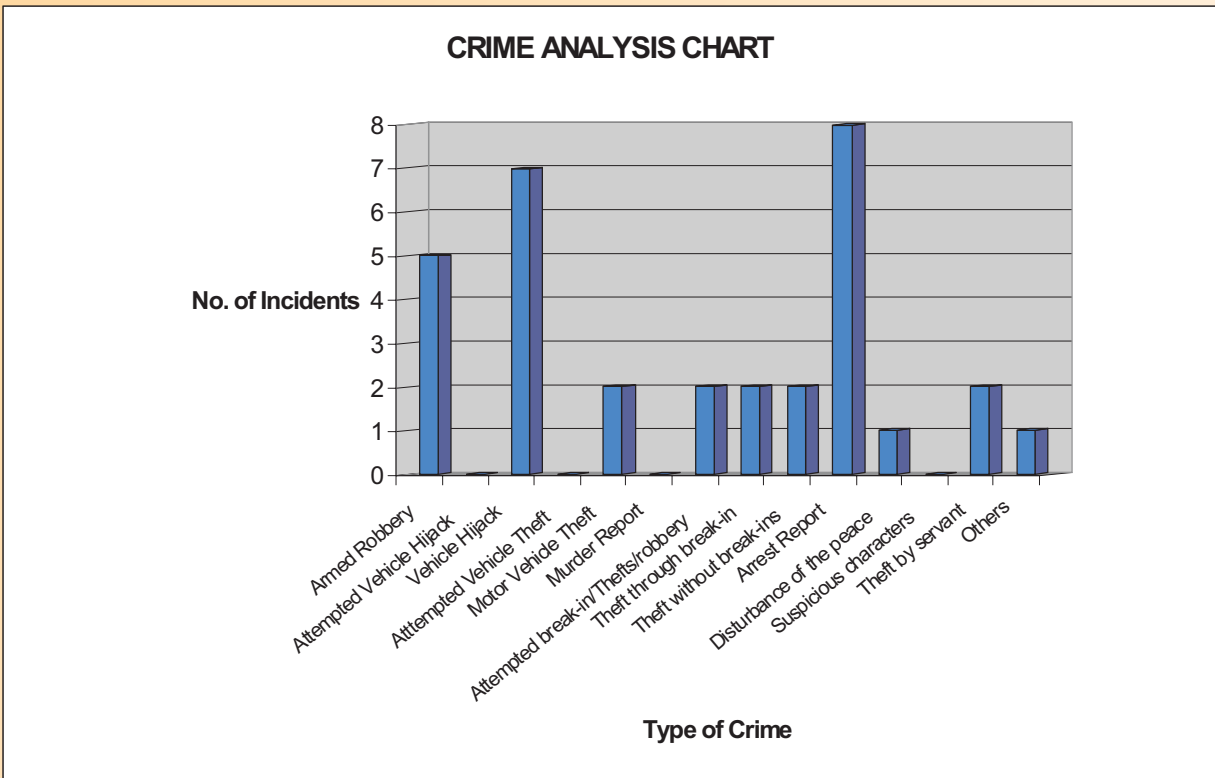
Alarm activation was received as indicated above and the area KK back up vehicle dispatched to attend. Investigations revealed that the client's visitor found her laptop missing from her car parked within the premises. Further investigations established that the visitor drove into the compound the previous evening and parked her car at parking lot and left the laptop inside. The following day she found the same missing. The vehicle was however locked and intact. Police officers from Spring Valley Police station visited and took the day and night guards for further interrogations.

Investigations revealed that the driver was driving slowly along the said road due to pot holes when three thugs armed with crude weapons appeared from Karura Forest. The thugs then stood in front of the vehicle and he was forced to stop to avoid hitting them. The thugs then got into the vehicle robbed the children money, mobile phones and schools bags before disappearing again into Karura forest. Police officers on board the KK back up accompanied the van back to the scene, combed the area for a possible arrest without any success. The driver was further escorted to Runda police station to make a formal report.

On arrival it was established that the alarm had been pressed by the private guards to report that the client while at the gate waiting to be opened for was accosted by three armed thugs and ordered him to surrender ignition keys. The thugs then blindfolded the client and bundled him into the rear seat. The thugs sped off in the client's car Registration Number KAQ XXX Toyota Lexus towards Eastleigh where they forced the client to open his office and robbed him some money. They later dumped him at Ngara.

The thugs emerged from the nearby bush and followed the tenants into the parking yard. They then robbed the tenant who was in the company of his wife 2 ATM cards, mobile phones, driving license, office keys, a handbag and a wallet containing Kshs.5,000/=. The tenant was requested to be escorted to make a formal report at Kabete police station but declined promising to do so in the morning.

After accomplishing their mission, the thugs went to where they had bundled the guards, clobbered one of them demanding for gate keys injuring him seriously. The thugs opened the rear gate which they used to remove their loot. The matter was reported to Industrial Area police station for further investigations.

Further report revealed that the thugs were trying to steal firewood from the compound but fled on realizing they had been spotted. The back up patrolled the surrounding premises and managed to arrest one suspect who was taken Muthangari police station for further investigations.

Alarm activation was received from the premises and the area KK back up vehicle dispatched to attend.
